"I was finally able to get some photos of the supposed Beach Mk4 bodywork sitting not too far from you. Turns out, it is actually a modified Lotus 23 set of bodywork. Pretty neat rear end conversion to look more like a Ferrari 512M, or similar. There is also a rear bodywork lattice support structure with some aluminum 'mudflaps' attached."







When I saw the photos...I thought this car might be a PA Hill climb car. I ran the number through my database and came up with a match! Richard Grime ran a #98 Lotus 23! I'll shoot him an emai! Sample from the database and Richard's response to my email.

"The background in the photos does not look familiar, but this is definitely the bodywork from my Lotus 23, circa 1970-78. I went to a great deal of trouble to make these modifications, with the idea that they would improve the aerodynamics of the car. The "mud flaps" were a necessary addition to prevent throwing stones etc. at closely following cars. These were aluminum panels mounted just behind the rear wheels and attached to the rear bodywork. I sold the car to Bud Hofer in 1978, and he is well along in restoring it to original specs. I don't think that the modified bodywork exists anymore, but I am not sure."


