VI. **2017 Supplementary Regulations**

Two proposals were made for changes to the 2017 PHA Supplementary Regulations:

- 1. To eliminate the 5-year expiration for harnesses as allowed in the current TTR. A Motion: John Pitman / 2nd: Tom Wuellette was defeated by Yes: 6 / No: 16 vote. The Supps will remain as before.
- To provide an Electric Vehicle class in Specials. Charles Greenhaus proposed two classes, for which he would draft classing rules. Dave Merritt agreed to work with Charles to help make consistent with the Supps.

VII. Critique of the 2016 season

Rich Rock – BMR events:

- 1. Jefferson Circuit (Summit Point) → increasing track rate still meets with negotiation from PHA each year
- 2. Reading events:
 - Security to prevent vandalism cost \$800 for the two events
 - Skyline Drive paving job has not been put out for bid
 - Paving sidewalk in the Pit area was completed
 - Additional road paving/repair was funded by BMR for \$12,000
 - Vinyl Reading stickers are available

Dave Merritt – STC events:

- 1. Polish Mountain:
 - Fire Department did a good job using sawdust in response to rain Saturday
 - We had more cars on the road (vs pits) this year, and that could be managed better in the future.
 - Donna Sumner indicated that workers need additional training on proper dress, instructions, cooperation, etc.
- 2. Shenandoah Circuit (Summit Point)
 - 74 drivers participated
 - Summit Point has offered same rate as 2016 (and as Jefferson) for 2017
 - Will plan doing the event for 2017, and include lessons learned
- 3. Rose Valley:
 - Trout Run Fire Department looking for new Chief
 - May look at using a different Fire Department

Discussion on making events more successful (esp. Polish Mountain)

- 1. Ted Theodore inquired about getting sponsorship for the PHA series, or events
- 2. Ted also mentioned working with Dave Williams regarding Polish marketing
- 3. Charles Greenhaus suggested a season pass, possibly with a discount.

PROPOSAL 1

11.1. RESTRAINT REQUIREMENTS

REPLACE:

- 8. All driver restraint systems shall meet one of the following:
 - SFI specification 16.1 or 16.5, FIA specification 8853/1985 including amendment 1/92 or FIA specifications 8853/98 and 8854/98.
 - A. Restraint systems meeting SFI 16.1 or 16.5 shall bear a dated SFI label. <u>The certification indicated by this label shall expire</u> on December 31st of the 5th year after the date of manufacture as indicated by the label.
 - B. Restraint systems complying with FIA specification 8853/1985 including amendment 1/92 shall be no more than five (5) years old. (Not all manufacturers are dating every belt in a set. They may be dating one of a pair of shoulder or lap belts or may only be dating one belt in an entire set. Scrutineers are reminded that restraint systems need only one date label.)
 - C. Restraint systems homologated to FIA specifications 8853/98 and 8854/98 will not have a date of manufacture label. Instead they will have a label containing the Manufacturer's Name, Type of Harness Designation and Date of Expiration which is the last day of the year marked. All straps in this FIA restraint system will have these labels. FIA restraint systems with the certification 'D ####.T/98' are equal to FIA specifications 8853/98 and 8854/98, and are therefore, acceptable restraint systems. FIA two-inch seat belts with the certification 8853/98 are acceptable restraint systems when used in conjunction with their corresponding FIA shoulder harness and anti-submarine straps.
 - D. If a restraint system has more than one type of certification label, the label with the latest expiration may be used.

WITH:

- 8. All driver restraint systems shall meet one of the following:
 - SFI specification 16.1 or 16.5, FIA specification 8853/1985 including amendment 1/92 or FIA specifications 8853/98 and 8854/98. FIA restraint systems with the certification 'D ####.T/98' are equal to FIA specifications 8853/98 and 8854/98, and are therefore, acceptable restraint systems. FIA two-inch seat belts with the certification 8853/98 are acceptable restraint systems when used in conjunction with their corresponding FIA shoulder harness and anti-submarine straps.

SFI and FIA harnesses are not subject to a time constraint but shall be in good condition (no cuts, abrasions, abnormal wear, etc.) Harnesses deemed not to be in good condition by the Chief Steward and another event official shall be instructed to effect changes before their next run at that event or before the next event.

PROPOSAL 2

<u>SPECIAL CLASSES:</u> Automobiles that are of a design and construction not covered in the TIME TRIALS RULES or these SUPPS may be placed in one of three classes based on engine displacement, Or One class for electric vehicles. All cars competing in this category shall conform to the following specifications:

- a) Meet the safety requirements as outlined in the TTR.
- b) Have operating suspension on all wheels.
- c) The chassis must be equally distributed along the centerline of the car.
- d) The body style may be open or closed wheel.

Class by engine displacement (multiplication factor of 1.5 shall be used for forced induction)

S1 – 0 to 1650cc

S2 – 1651 to 3500cc

S3 - 3501cc to 500 cubic in

EV1 – Electric Vehicle
