

# PHA Championship Series Year End Awards

# 1 Introduction

In addition to the class awards at each event, there are a number of year end awards presented to drivers who participate in the PHA Championship Series. For each award, points are calculated each event as described below, and the total for all of the events determines the series winners.

# 2 Eligibility

# 2.1 Lloyd Geib Memorial, Overall Points, Molti Miglia (Mileage)

In order to be eligible for the Lloyd Geib Memorial, Overall Points or Molti Miglia (Mileage) Year End Awards, a driver must compete in more than half of the PHA Championship Series events.

For example, if there are 8 events in the series, a driver must compete in 5 or more events to be trophy eligible. For a 9 event series, 5 or more events are needed, and for a 10 event series, 6 or more events are needed.

**Note on Multiple Cars at Same Event:** If a driver pays two entry fees and runs two cars at the same event, only one car will be eligible for year end points for these awards. In this case, the driver should make his/her choice of the car to use for points calculations known to the Chief of Timing and Scoring.

#### 2.2 Year End Class Points

In order to be eligible for a Year End Class Points Award, a driver must compete in more than half of the PHA series events **in the same class**.

Using an 8 event series as an example, if a driver competes in all 8 events, but runs 4 events in one class and 4 in another, he/she would not be eligible for a trophy in either class.

**Note on Multiple Cars at Same Event:** If a driver pays two entry fees and runs two cars at the same event, both cars will be eligible for year end points provided that they are not both in the same class.

<u>If both cars are in the same class, only one car is eligible.</u> In this case, the driver should make his/her preference of the car to use for points calculations known to the Chief of Timing and Scoring.

For example, given an eight event series, say a driver competes in class A for the first 3 events, and class B for the next 4 events. At the final event, the driver runs both cars (and pays two entry fees). In this case, the driver will not be eligible for a Year End Class Points trophy for class A because he/she only completed in 4 events in that class. However, the driver would be eligible for a trophy in class B, as he/she completed in 5 events in that class.

## 3 Awards

### 3.1 Lloyd Geib Memorial Award

The Lloyd Geib Memorial Award honors drivers who consistently win their class, and is presented to the first place winner only. Lloyd Geib Points are awarded at each event based on position in class and on how many participants are in the class. 10 Points are awarded for each driver that you beat in the class.

#### **Examples**

2 Entrants: 1st place is awarded 20 points, 2nd place is awarded 10 points

4 Entrants: 1st place is awarded 40 points, 2nd place is awarded 30 points, 3rd place is

awarded 20 points, 4th place is awarded 10 points

1 Entrant: 1st place is awarded 10 points

#### 3.2 Overall Points Award

The Overall Points Award honors drivers based on overall finishing position at each event, and is presented to the first place winner only. Overall Points are awarded at each event based on overall position in Raw Results:

1 Position = 100 Points

2 Position = 99 Points

3 Position = 98 Points

...

Position 99 and higher = 1 Point

#### 3.3 Molti Miglia (Mileage) Award

The Molti Miglia Award honors the driver who has driven the most miles in competition, and is presented to the first place winner only. Mileage is calculated by multiplying the number of runs made at an event by the length (in miles) of the course. The lengths of the current PHA Series courses are as follows:

Duryea: 2.25 miles Giants Despair: 1 mile Pagoda: 1.3 miles

Polish Mountain: 1.2 miles

Summit Point, Jefferson Circuit, Long Course: 1.7 miles

Summit Point, Shenandoah Circuit: 1.8 miles

Weatherly: 1 mile

#### 3.4 Year End Class Point Awards

Year End Class Points Awards are presented to all trophy eligible drivers. Class points are calculated as follows:

First Place = 10 Points

Second Place = 8 Points

Third Place = 7 Points

Fourth Place = 6 Points

Fifth Place = 5 Points

Sixth Place = 4 Points

Seventh Place = 3 Points

Eighth Place = 2 Points

Ninth Place and higher = 1 Point
